## Admission

## Applications are accepted for fall admission only.

Admission to the graduate programs in East Asian Languages & Cultures is handled jointly by the Department, Graduate College, and the Student Services office of the School of Literatures, Cultures and Linguistics.

#### PERSONAL STATEMENT/STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

The statement of purpose is an important element in the application package for graduate study. We would like 2-3 pages detailing your field of interest and the relation between your studies and/or work experience to date, your current interests, and your reasons for wanting to obtain a graduate degree in East Asian Languages & Cultures from our department. For those applying to the PhD, please include a detailed description of the research project you plan to

pursue in our graduate program.

#### Resume or CV

#### ACADEMIC DOCUMENTS

Provide scanned copies of your transcripts (a complete list of all courses taken and grades received) as well as any certificates of degree completion or diplomas for all the post-secondary schools you have attended (undergraduate and graduate programs). English translations should be provided when applicable, preferably from the school attended. We will accept translations done by the applicant. They should follow the same format, line-by-line, as the original document. Official documents (original or "attested" copies) will be required **if you are admitted**.

#### **WRITING SAMPLE**

A paper of 10-20 pages or an excerpt of similar length from a longer paper is required. The sample should showcase the applicant's academic ability. Please upload to the online application in the Program Specific section.

#### LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

Please provide three (3) letters of recommendation, preferably from professors familiar with your work. When you fill out the online application, you will need to include email addresses for all of your references. They will automatically receive an email from the online application with instructions on how to upload their letters of reference to your online application. If they don't receive this email or have trouble uploading their letters, they should email **SLCL Student Services**: <u>slclgradservices@illinois.edu</u>.

The information you submit online, as well as the application fee **(\$70 for domestic applicants, \$90 for international**), goes directly to the Graduate Admissions office. The online application materials will then be made available to the SLCL Student Services office, which will prepare your application file for the department's admission committee to review.

#### **ALSO REQUIRED**

ATTENTION: Tentative Policy on GRE and English Proficiency during the Pandemic For the 2020-2021 application season, the EALC Department is not requiring the GRE general test, and such scores will not be considered by the readers of applications in their deliberations. Select applicants will get further notice on how their English proficiency will be tested. # GRE Scores

The GRE is required, but there is no minimum score. It must be taken no more than 5 years prior to your first semester at UIUC. GRE scores should be sent by ETS to **the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, institution code #1836.** 

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY EXAMS

All applicants whose native language is not English are required to submit a **TOEFL iBT or Academic IELTS** score report. The test must be taken no more than 2 years prior to your first semester at UIUC. Minimum score requirements for admission to EALC with financial aid <u>provided</u> are 103 total with a minimum of 24 in the speaking section on the TOEFL iBT or 7 total with a minimum of 8 in the speaking section on the IELTS.

This requirement may be waived if you have completed at least 2 academic years of full-time study or have completed a graduate degree at an English-language university in an English-speaking country no more than 5 years prior to your first semester at UIUC. The requirement may also be waived if you were raised in and/or went to school in one of the countries on this list: <u>http://www.grad.illinois.edu/admissions/apply/exemptcountries</u>.

# These waivers are for <u>admission purposes only</u> and do <u>not</u> provide an exemption from the *English proficiency requirement for* non-native English speaking teaching assistants.

In order to hold a teaching assistantship (our most widely available source of financial aid), all applicants whose native language is not English MUST PASS the speaking section of the TOEFL iBT with a minimum score of 24, or the speaking section of the IELTS with a minimum score of 8.

# This requirement is <u>not</u> waived like the admissions requirement above and any teaching assistantship award "will be conditional" upon our receiving proof of your passing English speaking ability.

We would appreciate receiving your official score report by the application deadline or shortly thereafter, so please arrange to take any of these tests as early as possible in the application process. Have ETS send the TOEFL iBT score report to the **University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, institution code #1836.** If you took the Academic **IELTS**, please upload the score report to your online application.

#### FUNDING

In order to receive full consideration for all financial aid opportunities, your application must be complete (with all of the above materials in place) no later than January 4, 2021 at 11:00pm Central Daylight Time (same time zone as Chicago). All admitted applicants are considered for financial aid based on their application materials and available funds. Financial aid may be awarded in the form of fellowships, assistantships, or a combination of the two.

The University of Illinois has many opportunities for funding beyond those provided by the department. The Graduate College's financial assistance web page has more detail about the sources of funding available to graduate students. There is a fellowship database that lists fellowship funding potentially available to you. Students who are studying certain specific languages may want to look at the fellowships available through the FLAS Fellowships program.
